

VOLUNTEER ROLE DESCRIPTION YOUTH LEADER

As a fully trained Youth Leader you will support young people in the unit directly (Badgers or Cadets) by organising and delivering games, activities, and sessions as part of the relevant youth programmes. You will also be responsible for the supervision and support of other adult volunteers within your youth team.

WHAT YOU WOULD BE INVOLVED IN (DUTIES & RESPONSIBILITIES)

- Collaborating with your unit youth team to create an inclusive, safe and open environment in which young people can learn life skills including First Aid on a weekly basis.
- Leading, organising and supporting the preparation and delivery of the unit's programme in a fun and exciting way to ensure the engagement and satisfaction of those who attend.
- Ensuring the safety and welfare of all young people and adults within the unit are maintained to St John Ambulance safeguarding requirements at all times.
- Coordinating with colleagues in your youth team to ensure one trained Youth Leader is present at all . times, all adults without appropriate clearance are fully supervised and there are sufficient adult volunteers to meet supervision ratio requirements.
- Empowering young people and ensure appropriate adjustments for inclusion and participation of all young people and adults are made within your unit.
- Ensuring all young people and adults are treated equally and fairly by adult volunteers and to lead by example to maintain a respect and awareness of diversity in your unit.
- Understanding and applying all relevant youth policies and procedures, youth programme content and role requirements within your unit.
- Completing all necessary training for the Youth Leader role.
- Supporting the Unit Manager as required and share responsibility for the duty of care, health, and wellbeing of young people within your unit.
- Ensuring the parent/guardian rota is completed and all Parent/Guardian Helpers. 3 Week Challenge participants and adult visitors to the unit are fully supervised always.

WHO WE ARE LOOKING FOR (PERSON SPECIFICATION)

- A willingness to engage and support young people to learn life skills, including First Aid Required in a fun, interactive manner.
- An enthusiasm for St John Ambulance as an organisation and dedication to our vision. Required mission, and values.
- A commitment to the health and safety, wellbeing, safeguarding and inclusion of all Required young people and adult volunteers within your unit.
- A commitment to our Youth Voice principles (Support, Empower, Inspire) and Required supporting our young people to become future leaders.
- Able to work effectively as part of a team and to communicate well with other adults and Required young people. Desirable
- Has some experience working with young people or in a youth organisation.
- Willing to supervise young people on events and on camps and undertake required Desirable training to do so.

WHAT YOU WILL GET FROM THIS ROLE

- A sense of reward and satisfaction from contributing positively to your community by supporting young people to learn new life skills including First Aid
- Training for role with the opportunity to acquire greater responsibility or learn new skills
- New friends and colleagues as part of the St John family
- Experience within a youth organisation and skills in teamwork, responsibility and communication and the organisation and delivery of programmes which may be beneficial for your career.

ROLE SPECIFIC EXPECTATIONS

- This role is exempt from the provisions of the Rehabilitations of Offenders Act.
- Will complete appropriate training for role and keep knowledge of our youth programme uptodate.

SCREENING REQUIREMENT FOR ROLE (CATEGORY THREE)

This role requires the following pre-volunteering screening checks:

- Health Review (including driving if appropriate).
- Enhanced criminal record check (DBS) with Child Barring List.
- Professional Registration (PIN) check (only applicable for HCPs).
- Two written references.
- Identity checks.
- Volunteering role discussion.

TRAINING & SUPPORT PROVIDED

The training we will provide for you in your first six months is as follows:

- Welcome programme introducing you to the charity.
- Induction to youth unit, youth programmes, role, policy, and procedures with support from Unit Manager or Unit Youth Lead.
- First Aid for Youth Leaders training.
- Introduction to Safeguarding, Safeguarding Level 1 and Level 2 training.
- Training on appropriate IT systems such as Office 365, CONNECT, MyData, DIPS
- Youth Leadership training for role
- Driver training (if applicable).

• Demonstration Course

- Further training will be provided if desired as follows
- Training for Adventure Warrants
- Further First Aid training or Mental Health First Aid

SJA will provide workwear (a uniform) appropriate to the role excluding footwear and you will wear a 'Youth Leader' role bar when undertaking this role.

OUR VALUES
