

Demonstrator VOLUNTEER ROLE PROFILE

Is this for you?

Do you passionately support others to achieve their goals and ambitions? Do you want to motivate people to learn the skills you can share? Then you could support the training of St John people as a Demonstrator.

Impact

This role plays a huge part the Community Operations Training team, supporting Trainers to ensure outstanding quality training is provided to our people, enabling them to carry out their roles to a high standard.

Expected time commitment Line managed by 24 hours a year (usually at least four sessions a year) Usually a Unit Manager, with support from the District Training Team

What you would be involved in (responsibilities)

- Deliver skills and knowledge demonstrations to a high standard using provided session plans, materials and resources
- > Maintain current subject knowledge and competence
- Stay up to date with Continuous Professional Development (CPD) and maintain a Demonstrator portfolio
- > Ensure the health, safety and wellbeing of learners and the security of our venues
- Ensure equipment is clean and fit for purpose and that any damage or faults are identified and reported
- > Meet the needs of learners throughout the training session
- > Accurate completion and prompt submission of administration using relevant systems.

What you would be accountable for

- > Providing an inclusive, equal and diverse session for learners to achieve
- > Health, safety and wellbeing of our people including safeguarding
- > Providing great sessions which motivate and engage learners.

You will need to have the following (personal specification)

- Existing knowledge of at least one relevant area of St John training delivery (e.g. First Aid, buddy course, etc) that you can run demonstrations in
- > Appropriate literacy, numeracy and IT skills
- > Ability to communicate effectively verbally with a wide range of people
- > Ability to commit to evenings and weekends
- > Enthusiasm for the work of St John Ambulance and ability to model our values
- > Ability to work as part of a team
- > Understanding of SJA training procedures and protocols (optional).

What you will influence

- > Outstanding training standards through demonstration and skills delivery
- > Enabling others to achieve their goals and ambitions
- Engagement and motivation throughout sessions that will continue after the session in other organisational activity.

Training and support provided

The training and support we will provide for you is as follows:

- > Welcome programme introducing you to the project & wider charity
- > Qualification as a St John demonstrator
- > Training in appropriate SJA policies
- > St John Safeguarding training relevant to your role
- > Continuous Professional Development (CPD) opportunities
- > Out of pocket expenses.

SJA will provide uniform in this role.
